PREPARATION FOR THE MESSIAH

- The Intertestamental Period (400 BC AD 25) this is the era between the last prophet of the Old Testament (Malachi) to the ministry of John the Baptist
 - -Persian Rule (539-332 BC) the Persians allowed the Jews a measure of freedom.
 - -Hellenization of the world (332-167 BC) -Alexander the Great conquered the Persians and he "Hellenized" the world. Greek culture and Greek language spread across the empire.
 - -Seleucid Empire One of the divisions of the Greek Empire led by one of Alexander's generals. The region of Israel and surrounding area was ruled and Hellenized by the Seleucids.
 - -Antiochus Epiphanes In 169 BC, he launched an attack on the Jews in Israel. He entered Jerusalem and offered up pagan sacrifices in the Temple.
 - -Judas Maccabeus 167 BC he led a revolt against the Seleucids. Eventually, the Maccabees (Hasmoneans) defeated the enemy and won the independence of the Jewish State. The Temple was cleansed and re-dedicated (Hanukkah), the Greek statues were removed from Jerusalem, and the Jews ruled themselves through the priesthood.
 - -Roman Rule In AD 67, the Roman general, Pompey, conquered the Seleucid empire, including Israel. Israel had endured a civil conflict between two competing priests Hyrcanus and Aristobulus (brothers). Eventually, Pompey would side with Hyrcanus.
 - -Antipater was the chief of staff for Hyrcanus. He won the favor of Mark Antony and Octavian (Caesar Augustus). His

son was Herod! Eventually, Caesar Augustus would choose to work with Herod and allowed Herod to become King of Israel --- even though he was an Idumean and not Jewish.

- Roman Rule Greek Culture: By the time of the first century, Rome was securely in power. Rome built roads, established means of citizenship across the Empire, embraced the language of Greek, instituted Pax Romana, a central legal system, and an empire-wide identity.
- Galatians 4:4 "in the fulness of time, God sent forth his Son, born of a woman . . ."
- Matthew has used the first two chapters of his Gospel to clearly set forth the clear identification of Jesus of Nazareth to be the longanticipated Messiah.
- Matthew 3 The Intertestamental Period ends! God sent a prophet, a forerunner, John the Baptist, to announce the arrival of The Kingdom of Heaven/God!

JOHN THE BAPTIST

- All 4 Gospels mention the ministry of John the Baptist.
- John the Baptist announced the launching of the Kingdom of Heaven/God.
- Matthew presents John the Baptist as the fulfilment of prophecy.
- John was associated with the prophetic and Mosaic connections to the wilderness.
- John's message was both repentance and eschatological.
- John's primary role was to prepare Israel for the coming Messiah.
